The Challenge

Key to addressing the upcoming skills gap in construction is inspiring young people to consider careers in the industry. The Perth Transport Futures Project (PTFP) has been supporting the provision of Design, Engineer, Construct! (DEC!) at Perth Academy as part of its Community Benefits Strategy. 'DEC!' was devised by 'Class of Your Own' and is an accredited learning programme for secondary-school age students which has been expertly developed to create and inspire the next generation of Built Environment professionals.

The Measures

Through a project-based approach, DEC! applies pure academic subjects to the latest construction industry practices. The result is young people with real-world practical experience and employability skills. PTFP has invested £12,000 to fund the course over two years as well as supporting classes with guest lectures and practical activities led by
